# **Food Drive for Yazidi Refugees**

In 2015, **Operation Ezra** was created by a grassroots group in the Jewish community of Winnipeg to help bring **Yazidi families** from refugee camps in Turkey to Winnipeg. Having escaped Iraq, often on foot, they languish in these camps in difficult conditions after having escaped from terrible oppression, brutality and genocide at the hands of Islamic militants.

Operation Ezra is an interfaith **coalition of some 20 groups**, including the Jewish Federation of Winnipeg, the Salvation Army, Kings Fellowship, Bridges for Peace, Shaarey Zedek Synagogue, Jewish Child and Family Services and the Manitoba Multifaith Council. It has brought 55 Yazidis to Winnipeg for safety from the violence they suffered at the hands of ISIS in Iraq.

These refugees, being privately sponsored, are doing well, as refugees sponsored by private or faith groups usually do. But in addition to those families, about 180 other Yazidis have been brought here by the Canadian government. These government-sponsored refugees (GARs) are struggling. Operation Ezra has been also been helping them with food and support, but it is stretched thin.

**Charleswood United** has been invited by Operation Ezra to share in this effort to provide food. We are asking you to bring goods from the list to the church and place them on the table at the north end of the sanctuary during the month of September. At the end of the month, we will add some of the perishable items and make a delivery to Operation Ezra.
